## *Government Documents*

---

These are publications issued under the authority of a government (or one of its agencies) at the national, provincial or municipal level. Publications of international organizations are also included in this definition. Some of the Libraries' government publications are kept in the general, reference or periodical collections and are listed in CLUES. Many government publications are kept in the Government Information Services Unit on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor of the Webster Library and the main floor of the Vanier Library. The Webster Library Government Information Services Unit receives most material published by the Government of Canada (including Statistics Canada), as well as selected titles from Quebec and other provincial governments, and the city of Montreal. The Vanier Library receives a selection of documents from the Government of Canada, including Statistics Canada.
