## Education Databases and Periodical Indexes

---

Databases and periodical indexes are used to find references to articles published in journals and to find other types of documents (book chapters, conference papers, theses, etc.).

**Databases:** All of the databases listed below are accessible via the Concordia Libraries **Database Finder** page: <http://library.concordia.ca/research/databases/>

### **Academic Search Premier**

Multi-disciplinary database which indexes a large number of Education journals. Fulltext coverage varies from journal to journal.

### **Canadian Research Index**

Includes Federal and Provincial studies on education and related topics.

### **CBCA Education**

Focuses on Canadian information; coverage of over 130 journals, including 24 fulltext.

### **EDITLib Digital Library for Information Technology and Education**

Provides fulltext coverage of research literature on all aspects of educational technology and e-learning.

### **ERIC**

The **major index** for Education research; covers journal articles, research reports, conference papers, etc.

### **ProQuest Dissertations and Theses – Full Text**

Search over one million North American doctoral dissertations and masters theses; the majority of theses and dissertations from **1997 onward** are available fulltext.

### **PsycINFO**

Contains international coverage of journals, book chapters, and dissertations in Psychology and related fields; a useful complement to ERIC; updated weekly.

### **Sociological Abstracts**

Covers international research literature on various social aspects of education.

### **Source OECD**

Useful for comparative education, providing international perspectives on education issues.

### **Sport Discus**

Physical education, sports psychology, etc.

### **Web of Science**

Features citation searching (cited author/cited work, etc.) of over 1,700 social science journals.
