- 1. Argue: Prison labour is exploitative
- 2. **Propose**: Two possible interventions

Argument: Prison labour is exploitative

Is prison labour inherently unethical?

No.

Possible value of prison labour to the incarcerated:

- Money
- Enjoyment or satisfaction
- Develop skills for post-incarceration

Mutually beneficial exploitation

"Exploitation can also be mutually beneficial, where both parties walk away better off than they were *ex ante*. What makes such mutually beneficial interactions nevertheless exploitative is that they are, in some way, unfair."

Inmates in Canada:

\$5.25 - \$6.90 per day (2019)

Inmates in U.S.: \$0.86 - \$3.45 USD per day (2017)

Quebec Minimum Wage: \$14.25 per hour (May 1, 2022) Vermont Minimum Wage: \$12.55 per hour (2022) Oklahoma Department of Corrections received...

Prisoners received...

\$7.25 per prisoner per hour

\$1.45 per hour

Penal Labour Exemption

"Neither slavery nor **involuntary servitude**, except as **punishment** for crime whereof the party shall have been duly convicted, shall exist within the United States."

Exploitation

Proposal: Two possible interventions

Intervention 1

Hire the formerly incarcerated with memory work experience.

Intervention 2

Label items, collections, and databases that benefit from exploitative labour.

- 1. Include name(s) of prisoner(s); OR
- 2. Include a more general statement that incarcerated individuals performed this labour
